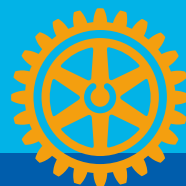

“Deep well and tank recovery”

Project description:

The communities of Ponce Bello and Barrio Central do not have the water supply service. The water supply for these communities depends on the operation of the well and a storage tank that have been inoperative for more than 10 years. Once recovered, a maintenance plan must be carried out that will ensure the operation of the system for 20 to 40 years, guaranteeing a lasting impact on the project's beneficiary communities.

Objectives:

- Guarantee the water supply service for consumption, cleaning and basic sanitation.
- Reduce morbidity from diarrhea and other diseases associated with poor hygiene in food preparation.
- Reduce morbidity from skin diseases and others associated with poor hygiene.
- Improve survival rates.
- Eliminate the time that women, children and the elderly dedicate to collecting and hauling water, which will allow them time for productive and educational activities.
- Encourage the productive use of this resource as a catalyst for local economies.
